

From the Desk of Pastor John

"I don't do church."

It's a common response when you ask someone, "Hey! Why don't you join me one Sunday for worship?"

Before we go any further, let's just go ahead and clear one thing up: the reason they "don't do church" has nothing to do with worship styles.

These individuals often have a picture in their minds of what "church" is ... and it's not pretty. To them, "church" is somewhere you go to get the latest gossip disguised as prayer requests that divulge too much information.* It's a place where you will be looked at funny for wearing the wrong clothes. It's where you go to sit on a stiff, uncomfortable pew for an hour (if you're lucky, it's just an hour!) while someone with a microphone gives you detailed instructions about getting on God's "good side" and tells you how you're doing it all wrong.

And you're supposed to show up and smile through it, or someone might realize you don't have it all together and condemn you to the eternal barbecue downstairs.

That sounds harsh, I know. But I've heard it, and I get it. I've met too many people who have been broken by the church; they've been led to feel shame and guilt for who they are instead of being loved by God and his people. For them, the gospel was NOT Good News, and church was NOT a place of welcome, comfort, and solidarity with other believers.

To use one of my favorite southern colloquialisms, "Something just ain't right with that!"

Simply put, love is to be the foundation on which our sacred community, Christ's Church, is to be built!

A church built up and braced by Christ's love? Now that is one beautiful, gospel-living, grace-filled church!

When we are back in our newly-restored sanctuary, we will begin a new chapter at Pilgrim. In the meantime, we can begin to draft how we want that chapter to be written.

Let's start with a simple question: "What kind of sacred community do we want to be?"

Prayer Shawl Ministry


1st & 3rd Tuesdays, 2:00 p.m. October 3, 17

THUMB- Colossians 4:2 Pray for those closest to you, closest to your heart, your loved ones.

POINTER FINGER - 1 Thessalonians 5:25 Pray for those who teach you, instruct you and heal you. They need the support and wisdom to point the way to others. Always keep them in your prayers.

MIDDLE FINGER - 1 Timothy 2:1-2 This "tallest" finger reminds us of our leaders, the governors and those who have authority. They need God's guidance.

RING FINGER - James 5:15 This is our weakest finger. It should remind us to pray for the weakest, the sick or those plagued by problems. They need your prayers. Pray for those who are weak or in pain

LITTLE FINGER - Philippians 4:6 Pray for ourselves. Your pinkie should remind you to pray for yourself. When you are done praying for the other four groups, you will be able to see your own needs but in the proper perspective, and also you will be able to pray for your own needs in a better way.
