# Joyful Noise Learning Center

Joyful Noise was very excited to receive our CLASS® Monitor scores from the Early Learning Coalition for our VPK classes. We were very happy with our score of 5.28 out of a possible 7. This is an improvement of over one point from last year! CLASS®, an acronym for Classroom Assessment Scoring System, is an observation based tool that measures the quality of teacher to child interactions in the classroom. Classroom interactions and experiences help children develop language and learn new concepts.



our veterans to Washington D.C., to be honored at their memorials and receive the welcome home they deserve." Two flights have been scheduled this year with nearly 100 Veterans on each, along with Guardians who serve to ensure a safe and memorable experience.

wonderful gift for our Pilgrims! It is nice to see many of you smiling and talking with one another. Everyone is encouraged to join this time of fellowship.

-Our Council continues to discuss the future for Pilgrim. We have a list of items that still need to be addressed around the campus, some of these items have been shelved since the hurricane. These items include purchasing a new commemorative stone for our memorial garden, replacing the tint on one of the Sanctuary windows, upgrading a security panel in the church office, and repairing/replacing a ladder to the attic. As we start getting back into the new phase of reconstruction in the Sanctuary, we will be checking these items off the list.

# **Property & Grounds**

The Property and Grounds Committee is motivated to have an attractive and safe environment for the church.

Highlights from our Property and Grounds notes for our March 14, meeting includes these projects:

The five live oaks purchased for the school are being cared for with water and fertilizer and are in a sunny place to avoid planting shock. They have a lot of new growth on them.

The island at the entrance to the community center will have the large East Palatka Holly trimmed of dead wood and the small volunteer oak will be allowed to grow.

A large 4 by 4 beam with predrilled holes was erected and set in concrete in the ground for the placement of the large composite cross which was blown over by Hurricane Ian. March 21 the cross was attached to the beam. The cross weighs around 300 pounds! It stands tall!

The driveway potholes were repaired with crushed shell, then overlayed with asphalt patch.

Discussion was held for a more permanent storage place of our golf cart - where it could be charged and secure, as well as, having a fund for future repairs and maintenance.

As our spaces on the rocks in the Memorial Garden are few, we discussed a second Memorial Garden near the old fountain between the Church and the Community Center. The goal is to have a meandering tree lined path between the two memorial gardens.

Pastor John's Office and the Church Office received a needed upgrade to LED lights thanks to the time of Property Team!

Much gratitude for such a committed group of Pilgrims! Thank you!

## Fruit of the Spirit (Galatians 5:22-23)

Love, joy, and peace appear to go together. It shows our relationship with God. When we spend time with God, we are full of love, full of heavenly joy, and full of peace. Love is the most important out of these nine. Without it, our good works have no use on earth (1 Corinthians 13:1). Joy goes deeper than a mere happiness, joy comes from the radiance, the brightness of God himself. Peace goes hand in hand with this attribute. Peace extends to others and our inner selves. With it, we have comfort in knowing God heals this broken world.

The next three reflect in our relationship with others: **patience**, **kindness**, and **goodness**. When this spiritual fruit is developed in us, we see others as God sees them, and we reach out to them with His

love manifested in us. This may include fellowship, hospitality, giving encouragement, helping with problems, and most of all, showing love.

Our final three: **gentleness**, **faithfulness**, and **self-control**, refers to how we handle opposition. As Christians, we are called to be faithful to Him who is always faithful to us. If we are faithful in the small things, God will reward us. (Matthew 25:22-23). Gentleness is a way for us to stand in contrast to the disorder and selfish conduct of the world, a display of God's love to those who are walking in darkness. By self-controlling our emotions when we are provoked to anger, we are able to demonstrate Christ's love to those around us and live peaceably with them.

## **Response to Recognize Earth Day**

What did God make on the fifth day? (The things that live in the water and the birds of the air.) What were the waters made for? (To be filled with animals and for those animals to live and make more animals.)

What's currently in the oceans, lakes and rivers? (Our water is filled with plants, animals, along with pollution, including plastics.) How does all that plastic get into the oceans and our other waterways? (Inappropriate disposal of plastics as we are using more plastics than we can properly dispose of. Once in the water, plastic debris never fully biodegrades.)

Do you think we have a responsibility to take care of the water? (It's one of the first things God asked of us in Genesis 2: The Lord God took the man, Adam, and put him in the garden of Eden to till it and keep it.) How do we do that? (Using less will translate to less plastic ending up in the water.)

Steps you can take to reduce the negative impact of plastics on our planet.

- Try doing a plastic-free Easter or Pentecost season, use the good china and silverware!
- Simpler ways to reduce single-use plastics are to bring your own reusable bags to stores and swap out plastic straws for metal straws.
- Educate yourself on your personal plastic use. How much plastic do you use on a weekly basis? What happens to your plastic waste after you discard it? What percentage of recycling in your state is actually recycled?
- Do a cleanup in your neighborhood or in a public space.
