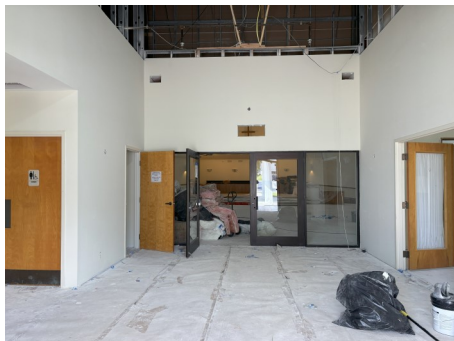

This would include sourcing and installing new oak baseboard trim as well as refinishing the old damaged trim that is still usable. We would also like to install the partitions, toilets and vanities in the bathrooms. The small kitchenette in the coffee room will also need to be sourced and installed before a certificate of occupancy is issued from the county and then we could resume services in the Sanctuary!

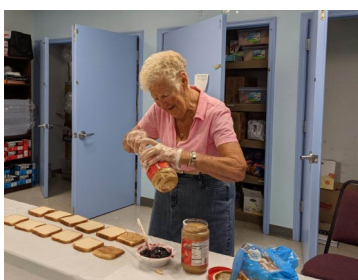

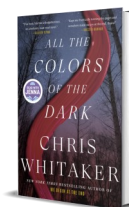

So we also have scheduled, PEARLS Program, a two hours training on school safety and what to do in the event of an intruder to the school. We had this training six years ago and anticipate it will be a great refresher/training for all.

NA is a nonprofit fellowship of men and women for whom drugs had become a major problem. We are recovering addicts who meet regularly to help each other stay clean. There is only one requirement for membership, the desire to stop using. There are no strings attached to NA. We have no initiation fees or dues, no pledges to sign, no promises to make to anyone. Anyone may join us regardless of age, race, sexual identity, creed, religion, or lack of religion. The newcomer is the most important person at any meeting, because we can only keep what we have by giving it away. We have learned from our group experience that those who keep coming to our meetings regularly stay clean.

The Property and Grounds Committee is motivated to have an attractive and safe environment for the congregation and friends of Pilgrim Church.

Scripture is Important

“All Scripture is inspired by God and is useful for teaching, for showing people what is wrong in their lives, for correcting faults, and for teaching how to live right. Using the Scriptures, the person who serves God will be capable, having all that is needed to do every good work.” - 2 Timothy 3:16-17

Everything written in the Bible is inspired by God. He communicated His words to men and led them to write it down for you and I to have as permanent preservation. The men who wrote His words were given to them by the Holy Spirit (1 Corinthians 2:13). The men were prophets that did not write their own interpretation of things but only what God had told them (2 Peter 1:20-21). Therefore, we can believe what the Bible says.

What you read impacts you. Think about how you feel when you read your news feed. Reading the Bible on a regular and consistent basis has several benefits. First, the Bible shows us God’s character and provides us God’s revelation of himself to his people. In

each section of the Bible, we see God’s holy, unchanging, faithful, gracious and loving character. Second, 2 Timothy 3:16–17 when discussing the topic of Scripture says that it is “profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction and for training in righteousness.” The next verse goes on to say that this leads to the completeness and equipping “for every good work” (ESV).

The word of God is part of the full armor of God. It is the only offensive weapon used to protect ourselves against the evil one (Ephesians 6:17). It is a powerful weapon to use to recognize Satan’s lies and tricks. Jesus used the word of God against Satan when he tried to tempt Him in the desert (Luke 4:1-14).
