Council Highlights

- Fall into thankfulness! As we enter into the fall and get closer to Thanksgiving, I want to make sure everyone knows how thankful I am and Council is for their continued support and time. There are so many of you that work countless hours behind the scenes that go unnoticed to support Pilgrim. We are thankful for you all!
- Thank you to our Property and Grounds crew who continue to make our Pilgrim campus secure and clean. After two back to back hurricanes rolled through Southwest Florida last month, we had a few issues that needed attention (nothing major). The buildings did get covered by some whipped up muddy rain, so they got a good scrubbing.
- Our Sunday Worship Committee comes together every Saturday to make sure the Community Center and (now) the Goodell Room are ready for worship and coffee hour. Our Council Clerk has reached out and invited several different speakers for worship to deliver the message and also ensures that the flow of Sunday service is consistent. We could always use an extra hand to make this happen, especially when together for Fellowship we come Breakfasts. Tear down requires the same amount of work, if you can help with that.
- The Pastor Search Committee continues the search for our Interim. As they continue the process, keep them in your prayers to find the right candidate for our congregation. They had two candidates scheduled to interview; but one has asked for their name to be taken out of the process.

- Council has spread some "sunshine" over at Joyful Noise the past few months, letting the staff know that they are appreciated. We love to add our own little puns to the messages that we bring to them and bring a few smiles. This is a great way to bring the school and the church together and let them know we are here to support them.
- Finance is starting the process of compiling the Annual Budget for next year. If you want to join the discussion or have any ideas, please come to the next Finance meeting. November 18, at 6:30 p.m., in the Conference Room. We would love to have your voice!
- Council will be rolling out "The Top 10 Most Wanted" list to our bulletins and newsletters. Many congregation members would like to donate to specific items; so the Council decided to roll this oldie out again. They are putting a list together (with prices) for the congregation to donate towards.
 - The very first item on this list that we definitely know and have a quoted price is the AC in the church office and conference room. The unit is over 14 years old and at the end of the year AC prices are expected to increase significantly due to mandated changes with the systems and types of coolants. Waiting too long will cost us more money. The cost is around \$8000 if you would like to donate funds.

Property & Grounds

The Property and Grounds Committee is motivated to have an attractive and safe environment for the church.

Cat Foster, our church secretary, had observed many need-to-do items and created us a projects list:

- During the day, Denny Vought and Tom Jones power washed debris from 2 sides of the Sanctuary Building and cleaned the exterior windows on those two sides.
- Donna and George Yorkston picked up sticks, straightened gutter downspouts, checked the electrical room back wall for moisture and noted a lot of paint and tools there as well. Donna and George then measured the Memorial Rock to make it possible for Cat to get a quote on another one as the spaces for memorial names on the existing two rocks are gradually depleting. They then temporarily reattached the wiring cover for the Emergency light in the Conference room.
- Jessica is currently at work on items in Pastor's office and cleaning out items in the nursery.
- The piano in room 4 deemed unrepairable by Maverick. It is quite heavy! We voted to dismantle it.

Hurricane Milton preparation included:

- The rose window has been shuttered for now and will remain so for it's protection.
- Many thanks to Cat Foster for shutting all the electronics down in the office to prevent storm damage, then for coming on Saturday and booting it all back up.
- We parked the golf cart in the Sanctuary and the Joyful Noise bus was under the portico.
- Water barrier bags were placed at doorways to prevent flood damage.

• The temporary solar light in the parking lot was removed.

Other news:

- The Disaster Relief representative from United Church of Christ Office, Katie Howe, was given a tour through the property to see the planted trees, removal of damaged white 4 by 4s, pruning of larger trees, and installment of new shade cloth for the playground. These were purchased with their grant money to us in October 2022.
- Conduits for the Sanctuary and Community Center were repaired.
- The ice machine in the community center was repaired by George.
- The 8:18 storage pod has been emptied of its plumbing, acoustical tiles, AC unit, and other essential items and has been removed from our property.
- We discussed shutters on the high windows of the community center.
- The mower is being transferred to Tom's house where he can work on it.
- We discussed setting up the bathroom partitions on our own.
- Most of the newly transferred trees were blown either partly or all the way over by Hurricane Milton. They all have wind burn as most of the trees in this town, but they will come back. A good sign of this return from trauma is their loss of leaves. The trees will be watered every two or three days. This should help them resprout even this late in the season.

Our next meeting will be Wednesday, November 6, at 6:30 p.m.

Thanksgiving Bible Study

Good Deeds Produce Thanksgiving

Jesus died upon the cross to purify for Himself, a group of people zealous for good deeds (Tit. 2:14). As Jesus' people, we work diligently in our Lord's kingdom, to do the good works God prepared beforehand (Eph. 2:10).

As we do the Lord's work, we affect the lives of others. The result is thanksgiving, directed toward God.

- People in the world see our good works and glorify God (Matt. 5:16).
- Good deeds directed toward our brethren produce thanksgiving to God (2 Cor. 9:11).

As we go through our day-to-day walk, letting our light shine as God's children and doing the good deeds He has ordained, it causes others to glorify God and give thanks.

Thanksgiving in Prayer

When we pray, expressing our concerns to God, we should take time to express our thankfulness.

- We tell God our problems, making our requests known to Him with thanksgiving (Phil. 4:6).
- We are devoted to prayer, staying alert in it with an attitude of thanksgiving (Col. 4:2).
- We rejoice, praying without ceasing, giving thanks to God (1 Th. 5:16-18).

A thankful life is a prayerful life. A life void of prayer is an unthankful life.

Thanksgiving in Heaven

We don't know a lot about heaven, often making

us wonder what it will be like. One thing occurring in heaven is thanksgiving.

- The angels in heaven give thanks to God (Rev. 11:17).
- When we get to heaven, we will give thanks to God for salvation, as those who were washed in the blood of the Lamb (Rev. 7:1-15).

If we're not thankful in our prayers upon the earth, it's doubtful we'll live in heaven, where we'll be busy offering thanks to God and our Lord Jesus Christ.

Every Day is Thanksgiving, for Christians

As we experience God's goodness in our lives, and offer thanks to Him, we could say that every day is a day of thanksgiving. We don't feast upon turkey every day, in observance of a secular holiday, but we offer our thanks to God in prayer, reflecting our thankfulness in everything we say and do.

- The result of our thankful lives, doing the good works God has ordained, is that it produces thanksgiving to God.
- The effect of things we do upon the earth is far reaching, even reaching the throne of God.

Whatever you do in the bustle of day-to-day life, remember to give thanks. And live in such a way that others, who watch you and experience God's goodness from your hands, can't help but pause and offer up a prayer to express their thanks. In these ways, God will be glorified, and receive the thanks He deserves.
