

Jesus' Appearances

Jesus first appeared to a woman of questionable reputation, Mary Magdalene. She came to the tomb to find it empty. Two men ask what she was looking for. She replied, "What have they done with Jesus?" The men said, "He is not here. He is risen." She turned into the garden crying. Suddenly, she encountered Jesus, though she thought He was the gardener. Through her tears she did not recognize Him until He called her by name, Mary. Then she called him Teacher. He instructed her not to embrace Him since He has not gone to God.

This first encounter is interesting that it was to a woman, since women did not have great standing. It seems to me that through the Resurrection there was a major transformation in Jesus' nature that folks did not recognize Him right away.

Later the disciples gathered in the Upper Room behind locked doors in fear for their lives because of the crucifixion. When Jesus appeared, they were stunned at first. He said, "peace be with you." Putting them at ease and they affirmed that Jesus was their Master, and believed. However, the disciple Thomas was not there. When he heard the news he said he needed to see Jesus' hands and side and touch them to believe.

Another day Jesus entered the Upper Room, and greeted the disciples. Thomas made his request to

see Jesus' hands and side, to confirm He was the Risen Christ. Thomas believed. Jesus said, "blessed are those who have not seen and believed." The Risen Christ Jesus wants us all to believe His resurrection by faith.

Two men, apparently followers of Jesus, aware of the events that just happened in Jerusalem, were walking to Emmaus. Jesus joined them on the journey. They noted amongst themselves that He talked as one with great knowledge of scripture. As custom in those days of hospitality, they invited Him in to break bread. It was only at the breaking of bread that they recognized Jesus.

Another time He was building a fire for breakfast at the seaside of Tiberi. Seven disciples were fishing and caught nothing. Jesus called out to them "Did you catch any fish?" "No" they answered, Jesus instructed "cast your nets on the other side." They did and caught many fish, which they brought to Him to cook and recognized Him as Risen Lord.

Jesus, the Risen Lord, appears to us in many forms, being transformed by the power of the Resurrection. Most of the time He comes to us in our every day lives in the breaking of bread, in moments of doubt and fear, in the mundane of life.

Lord we believe, help our unbelief.

Joyful Noise Learning Center

The month of May brings Joyful Noise to the end of our calendar school year, along with most schools across Charlotte County. We will still provide care for those students staying in our center throughout the summer, along with our school age summer camp program.

Teachers attended several trainings presented by the Early Learning Coalition during the month. These trainings were offered as part of our yearly continuing education requirements - with no out of pocket cost to the teachers or the center. We learned about effective behavior strategies, classroom management strategies, play-based learning techniques in math and early literacy, how to streamline schedules and routines, and to create lesson plans that reflect the needs of students and fulfill the new state standards. These classes are designed to bring teachers together and share ideas and techniques while learning from one another. It was a lot of fun!

Our **playgrounds** need some TLC and a facelift. Several playgrounds have been closed since Hurricane lan and need some work in order to reopen to students once again. Wood fencing needs replacing in one area due to a safety concern, equipment needs replacing due to age, and dirt needs to be brought in to fill holes caused from erosion over time.

The Property and Grounds Committee started this project already. Council approved their request to replace the wood fence with a more economical material (chain link). They have purchased the materials and will install. They are pricing out play equipment, shade, and dirt for the holes. They continue the discussion on what can be done for the continued erosion and tree root exposure.

We will have a week of fun and appreciation from May 5-9th for our teachers during "**Teacher Appreciation Week**". Hope is happening here! Pilgrims are working together to keep our church moving forward. Each one of us has a gift to share and we need you to share them with the congregation. The final insurance claim check from Hurricane Ian was received from the insurance company for Joyful Noise and the Community Center. The funds granted will be used to finish these buildings, making them **100% complete and ready for our hurricane season**.

Our lawyer has contacted the Bankruptcy Court seeking more information from them on the proceedings of our original contractor in their filing of bankruptcy. The information gained will determine our next steps moving forward with that case.

The case with our current contractor will move to mediation to determine whether we file a lawsuit or settle outside of the courtroom. The lawyer will sit down with a small group of us and the contractor and his legal representative to discuss the issues, concerns, and remedies. I will continue to share information as it becomes available.
