Acts 2:1–4; John 14:25–27

Ewing's Doings

In the Gospel of John, Jesus tells His disciples that although He is leaving to return to the Father, He will not leave them alone. The Holy Spirit will be the Comforter and Guide that Jesus promised. This promise was fulfilled at Pentecost.

Pentecost is known as the Christian festival celebrating the gift of the Holy Spirit, this day is often called the Birthday of the Church. It takes place fifty days after Easter, as recorded in Acts 2:1–4: The apostles and other followers of Jesus were gathered together, most likely to celebrate Shavuot, the Feast of Weeks. This feast, instituted through Moses, marked the end of the harvest and offered thanks to God for His abundant blessings (Deuteronomy 16:9).

As one of the major Jewish celebrations, people from all over gathered in Jerusalem. Luke tells us in Acts that the apostles and followers of Jesus were together in one place, perhaps a large home, or more likely the temple, known as the House of God.

As they gathered, suddenly a sound like the rush of a mighty wind came from heaven and filled the entire house. Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared and rested on each of them. They began to speak in different languages as the Holy Spirit enabled them, and all were able to understand one another. The presence of the Holy Spirit was revealed in the tongues of fire, symbolizing boldness and conviction in proclaiming God's truth.

With the gift of the Holy Spirit comes understanding and a calling to share the Good News as Jesus instructed (Acts 1:8).

After receiving the power and gifts of the Holy Spirit, the apostles immediately went out and preached Jesus' message to everyone, marking the beginning of the Christian Church's mission in the world.

Take time to reflect on this day, and find a way to show gratitude for the gift of grace that comes to us through the Holy Spirit at Pentecost.

Happy Birthday, Church! Amen.

Property & Grounds

The property and grounds team is dedicated to providing a safe and welcoming environment for our church and school campus staff and visitors.

This is a summary of our accomplishments for the past month:

Church

- Installed an electrical outlet in the kitchenette cabinet for a refrigerator and connected the refrigerator
- Installed room dividers separating the church coffee room from the sanctuary
- Installed the faucet and drain in the church kitchenette
- Moved the large refrigerator from the back storage area into the coffee room and cleaned the condenser
- Began removing tile to the main entrance to the church
- Fabricated a chair moving dolly for moving the new chairs for the church sanctuary
- Started the installation of the faucets in the men and women's bathrooms

What Happened to the Twelve Disciples?

After the ascension of Jesus (Acts 1:9–11), the apostles were commissioned to carry the gospel “to the ends of the earth” (Acts 1:8). The Book of Acts follows some of their work, especially Peter and John, and then focuses on Paul. For the rest, we rely on early church tradition. Together, these accounts show remarkable faithfulness.

Peter

A central leader in the early church, Peter preached at Pentecost (Acts 2) and helped establish the church in Jerusalem. He later ministered in places like Antioch and is traditionally associated with Rome. Jesus foretold Peter’s martyrdom (John 21:18–19). Early tradition records that Peter was crucified in Rome under Emperor Nero, reportedly upside down.

James (son of Zebedee)

The brother of John, James was the first of the Twelve to be martyred. Scripture records that he was executed by King Herod Agrippa I (Acts 12:1–2).

John

The brother of James, John was a leader in the early church and later lived in Ephesus. He is traditionally credited with writing the Gospel of John, three epistles, and Revelation. He was exiled to the island of Patmos “because of the word of God and the testimony of Jesus” (Revelation 1:9). Tradition holds that he was the only apostle to die of natural causes.

Andrew

Peter’s brother Andrew is said to have preached in regions north of the Black Sea and into Greece. Tradition holds that he was crucified on an X-shaped cross in Patras.

Philip

Philip is associated with ministry in Asia Minor. According to tradition, he preached in Phrygia and was martyred in Hierapolis.

Bartholomew

Often identified as Nathanael (John 1:45–49), Bartholomew is said to have taken the gospel to Armenia, possibly India. Tradition says he was martyred, by being flayed and then beheaded.

Matthew (the tax collector)

Also known as Levi (Matthew 9:9), Matthew authored the Gospel bearing his name. Tradition places his ministry in Ethiopia or Persia. Accounts of his death vary, but many say he was martyred.

Thomas

Known for his initial resurrection doubt (John 20:24–29), Thomas later made a bold confession of faith. Tradition strongly associates him with mission work in India. Thomas is believed to have been martyred there, pierced by spears.

James (son of Alphaeus)

Sometimes called “James the Less,” is recorded in the lists of the apostles. Tradition suggests he ministered in Syria or Persia and was martyred.

Thaddaeus

Also called Jude (Luke 6:16; Acts 1:13), he is linked by tradition with ministry in Edessa (modern-day Turkey) and surrounding regions. He is believed to have been martyred, possibly in Persia.

Simon (the Zealot)

Very little is known from Scripture beyond his name (Luke 6:15; Acts 1:13). Tradition places his missionary work in Persia or possibly North Africa. He is believed to have been martyred.

Judas Iscariot

The disciple who betrayed Jesus, died before the ascension (Matthew 27:3–5; Acts 1:18).

Matthias

In Acts 1:21–26, the remaining apostles sought the Lord’s guidance to restore their number. Matthias was chosen. He had been among Jesus’ followers from the beginning of His ministry through the resurrection, making him a firsthand witness to Christ’s work. Although Scripture does not record his later ministry in detail, early church tradition holds that Matthias faithfully preached the gospel in Judea and possibly in regions such as Cappadocia or near the Caspian Sea. Traditions affirm that Matthias was martyred for his faith, remaining steadfast in the same apostolic mission entrusted to the original Twelve.

While the Bible gives detailed accounts for only a few of the apostles, the consistent testimony of early Christian tradition is that most of them suffered and died for their faith. Their lives reflect the truth of Jesus’ words: “You will be My witnesses...to the ends of the earth” (Acts 1:8).

From Jerusalem to Rome, from Africa to India, the apostles carried the gospel across the known world: planting the seeds of the global Church we are part of today.

As their story continues through us, how is God calling you to share the gospel in your own corner of the world?
